Qatar's Research Landscape

- **3,080,804** total population Qatar (May 2024)
- **5,628** (incl. 3,478 researchers) R&D personnel (2021)*
- 1,222M USD (0.68% of GDP) Gross domestic expenditure on R&D (2021)*
- **30+** Universities and Research Centers
- 6,558 publications in 2023, 54% open access (Scopus)
- **4** Open Repositories (OpenDOAR)
- **13** Open Access Journals (DOAJ)
- Qatar Research Development and Innovation Council (QRDI-C) is the main research funding agency



How can we make Qatar's research accessible and instantly available?







Objectives of the program

To cover open access publishing costs for Qatar-based researchers

• To create and contribute to the permanent archive of Qatar-based research at the QNL.



Why have a fund?

- Qatar based researchers want their articles to be open access
- The choice of publishing open access is dependent on availability of funds
- There is a lack of institutional support in Qatar for open access
- There is a lack of sufficient funding support from research grant agencies



How we process payments?

Central payment through agreements

Two types of agreements:

Agreements for fully open access publications

Agreements that combine reading and publishing

Payment of individual requests through QF Procurement (OAAF)

Two types of payments

Purchase order (PO)

Credit Card Payment

SHIFTS COSTS

Leverages Read and Publish agreements to shift cost from subscription to publishing. Qatar first in the region to have such agreements on a national level

CONSORTIUM LED

Agreements through QNL Consortium consisting of 10 institutional libraries in Oatar



SUPPORTS QATAR BASED **AUTHORS**

Addresses absence of institutional funds and mandates for open access

MAKES AN IMPACT

Higher open access adoption leads to wider global reach and increases in citations of Qatari research. Positions Oatar a regional leader in open access



OA Program in Numbers

- Since the Open Access Program's launch in 2016, QNL has received a remarkable 10,000 funding requests in Qatar, underscoring the popularity and need for additional funding resources. The program has supported 5,869 articles by 2,249 different authors in Qatar, representing 44 institutions.
- In 2024, the OA program has seen a significant increase in demand, receiving 2,016 requests, which is 11% more than the number of requests in 2023 (1,814).





Manara – a service by QNL for Qatar-based researchers








Manara = *lighthouse* in Arabic

What are the goals of Manara?

- Allows researchers to deposit their research outputs, including <u>traditional</u> <u>academic</u> works and <u>non-traditional academic</u> outputs such as datasets, conference posters, and presentations.
- Home for research outputs in Arabic
- Legacy Archiving (changing landscape of universities in Qatar)



Manara as an infrastructure solution

In 2024, QNL signed agreements with Hamad bin Khalifa University and the University of Doha Science and Technology for Manara to be used as their research repository.

Some challenges



Issues with open access agreements

- Expensive
- Complicated
- Terms not always equitable
- Licensing terms complicated
- Lack of transparency from publishers



Limited budgets

- Demand exceeds supply of available budget/vouchers
- Limited cost-sharing between institutions for higher demand



Limited budgets

- More budgets needed to address gaps in read and publish agreement
- Read and publish agreements vs Fully gold publishing agreements
- Less budget now available for fully gold publishing agreements




"Misuse" of CC-BY NC and CC BY NC-ND licenses

We are not happy with how some publishers use non-CC BY licenses, where authors no longer retain commercial rights

We are moving from a subscription access problem to an open access publishing problem
