




Multi-Tenant Architecture

- One instance of software system
 - Like apartment complex
- Multiple tenants

 - Private
 - Secure
- Same infrastructure



A single application instance serves multiple tenant, each with their own isolated data, like apartments in a building.






- >> Diverse sharing of knowledge



- >> accelerate niche community-specific research








2010 – 2022: 389 articles published

Removal of financial barriers






