

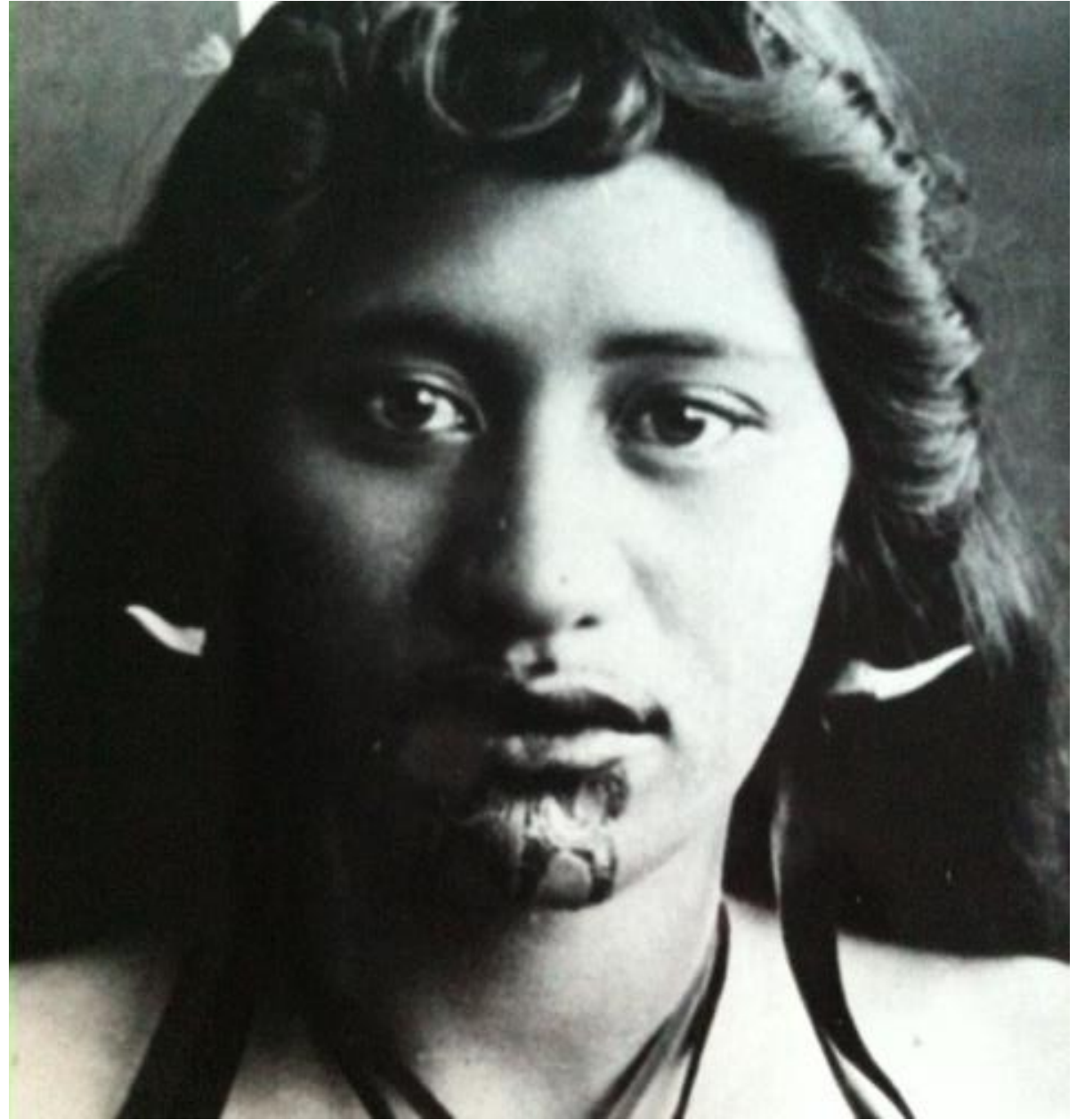
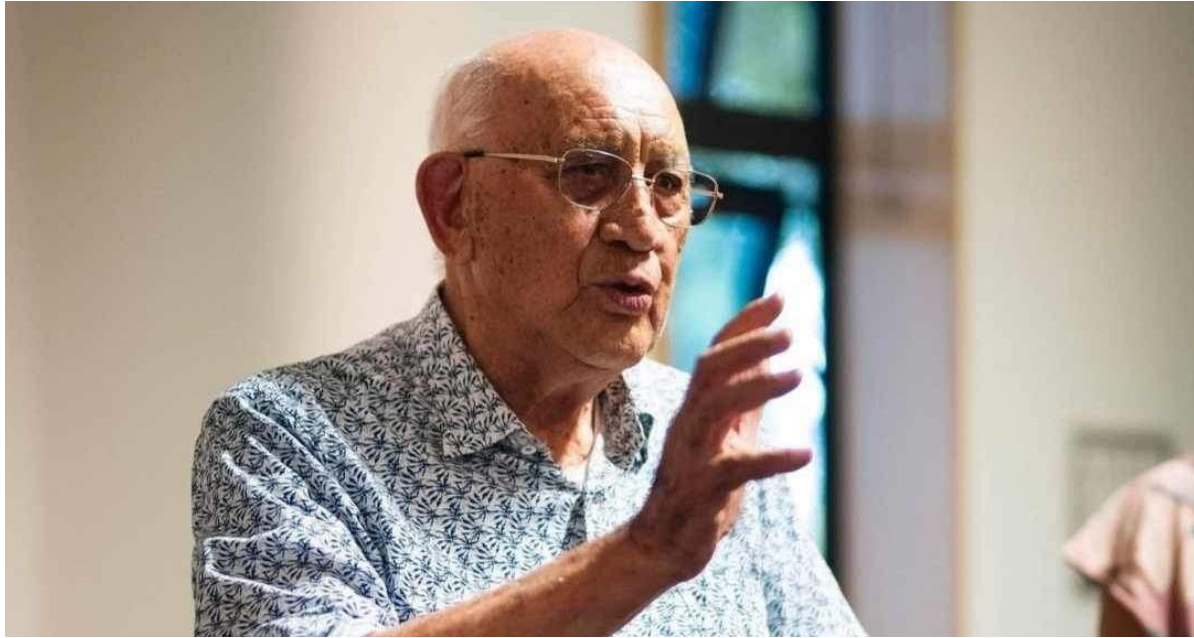
Where I am from is who I am and why I write
